Language learning:

Focus on French

Basic skills development:

Basic level: no formal education at all
Advanced level: formal education but
no skills in the Latin alphabet

Formal education:

CLIIA + for young adults
9+i for adults

Language learning and basic skills are offered for 100 hours during 2 months*
